**Selection Criteria** 

This Award will be granted through a competitive review process evaluated by an independent committee of

faculty members. The selection of recipients will be based on the quality of the proposed research, its relevance to

the mission of the Reserve, and the educational background of the student. The research must take place entirely

or in large part at the Gault Nature Reserve (Mont-Saint-Hilaire, QC) or at the Wilder and Helen Penfield

Nature Conservancy (Lake Memphrémagog, QC). A maximum of 10,000\$ will be awarded per project. Candidates

should also meet the following criteria:

Is or will be an undergraduate or graduate student at McGill University during the coming academic year

(2023-2024) or was a student in the previous academic year (2022-2023);

Demonstrates a strong interest in field-based research or data that is relevant to Gault's mission;

Commit to participating in outreach activities highlighting their research with local communities and visitors

of the Reserve (e.g., blog posts, informational kiosks, etc.)

A CV including a summary of past training and research experience;

A University transcript;

A one-page (maximum) description of the proposed research;

A support letter from the project supervisor(s);

A plan describing the proposed use of the funds.
